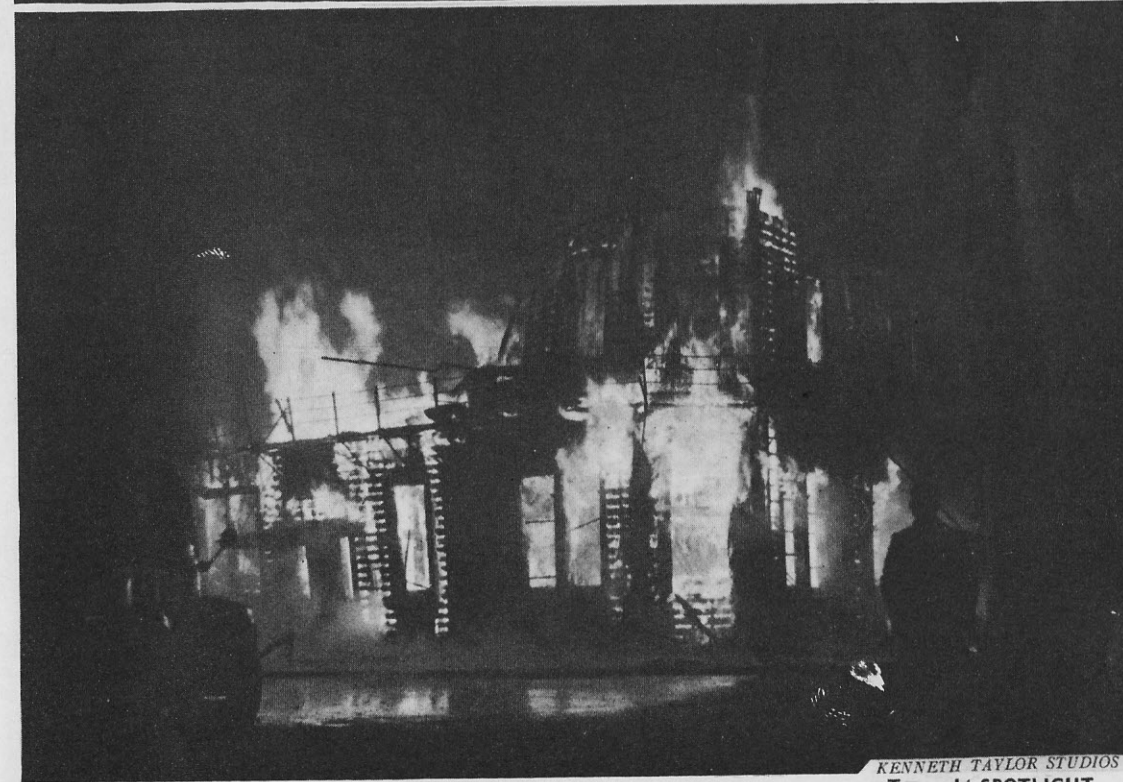
BIG HOTEL FIRE

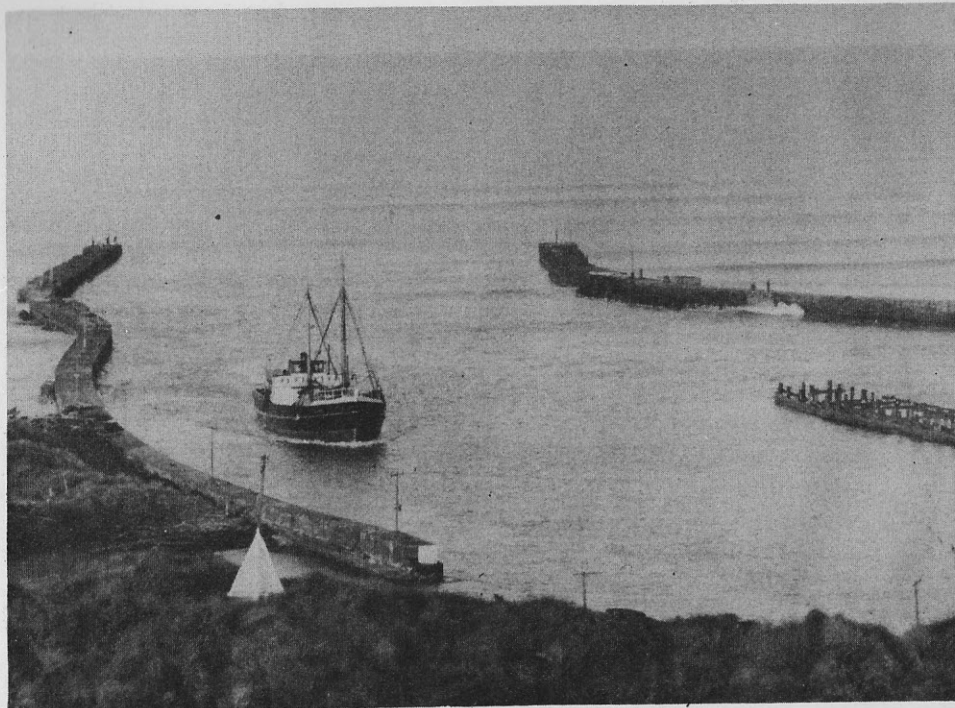

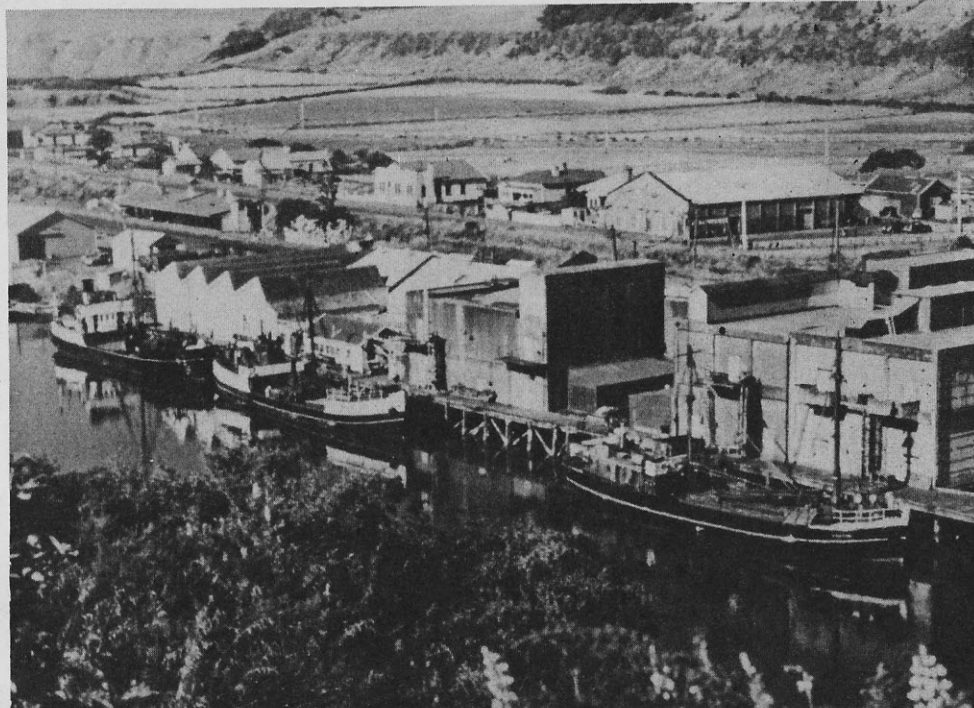

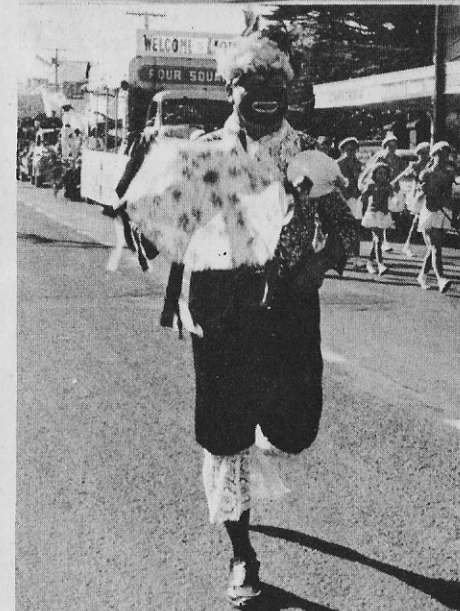
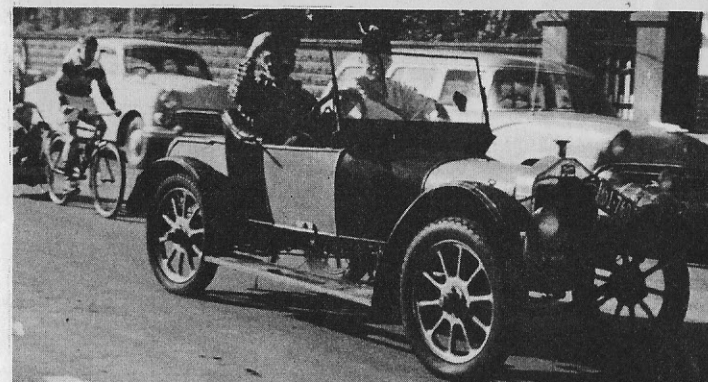
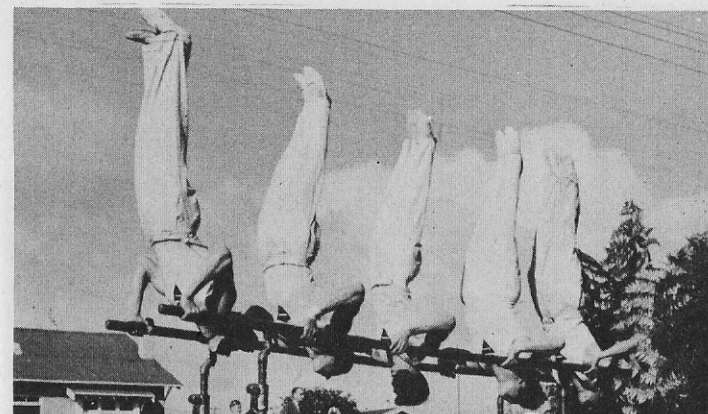


HOW WE WELCOMED THE LIONS

Preceding the Lions Taranaki match at New Plymouth Devon Street became the scene of football fever. 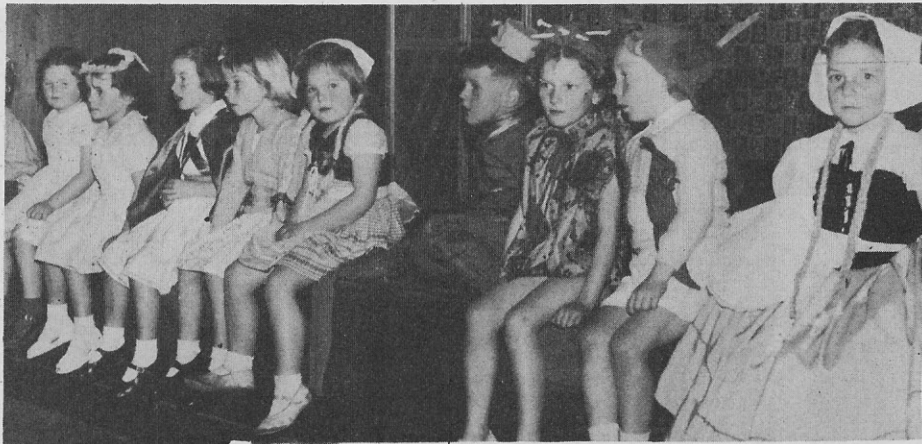
