














"Iclanthe", Gilbert and Sullivan's musical comedy has been produced at both Stratford and New Plymouth.





Waitara's War Memorial Centre, one of the three largest buildings in Waitara, is 230 feet long, with a width of 62 feet at the widest part and an overall height of 30 feet. The building, constructed at a cost of £45.000, £22,000 of which local residents subscribed, contains a games hall (above) measuring 106 feet by 60 feet, and a concert hall (below) 72 feet by 50 feet, a kitchen, canteen, cloakrooms, conveniences and showers, as well as a large foyer.





REMOVING PARTS OF OLD EXCHANGE


