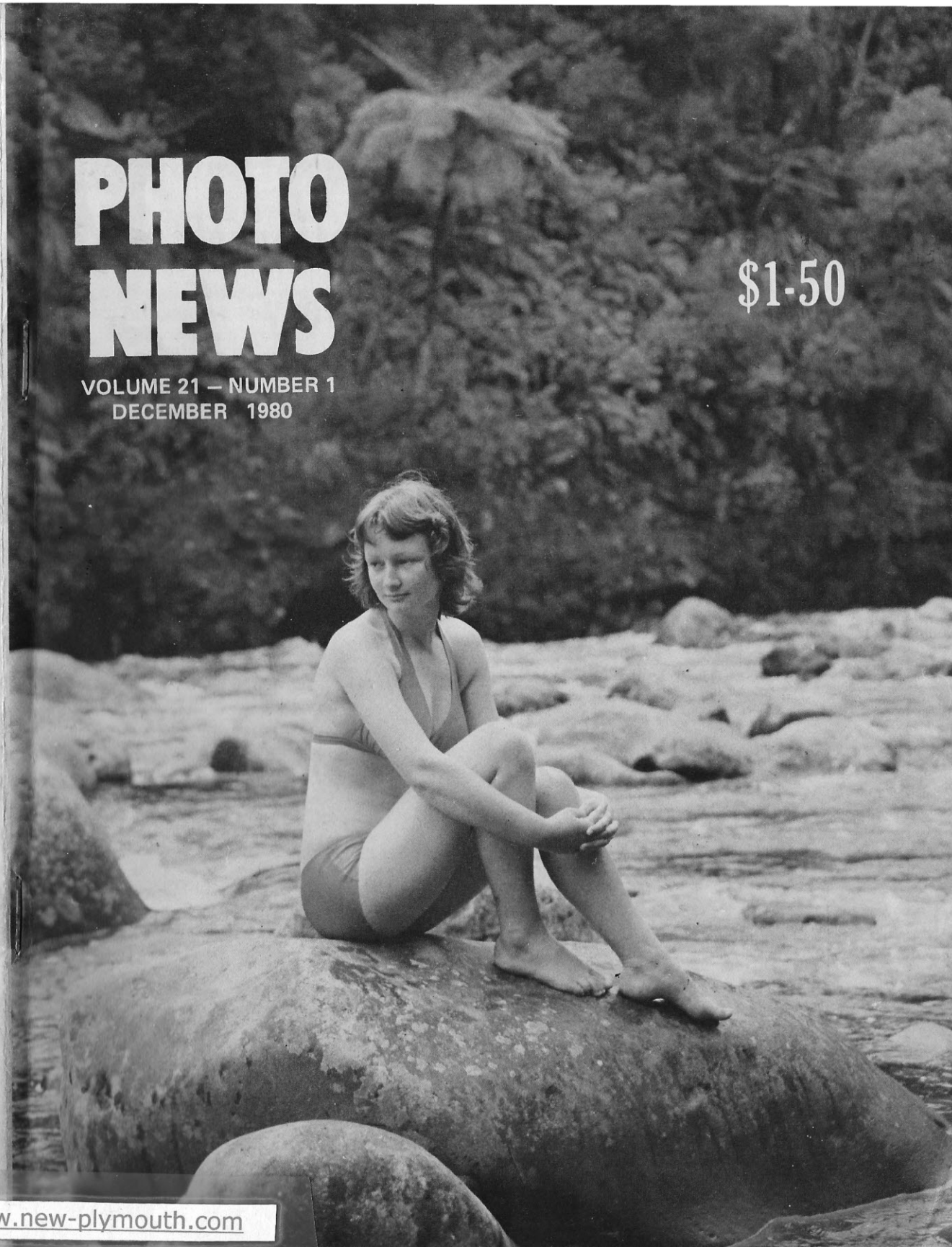

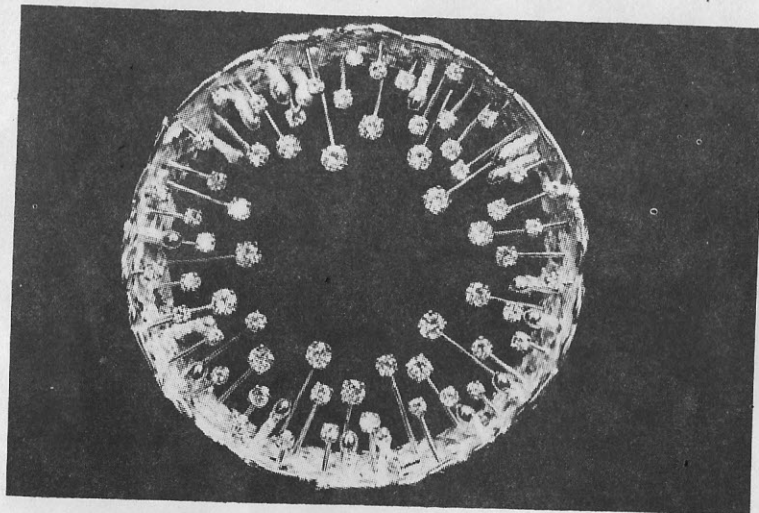

The unique format that only Photo News can offer and it's place as a community magazine has not been forgotten in the past five years and we must also admit, "It's Great to Be Back Again".

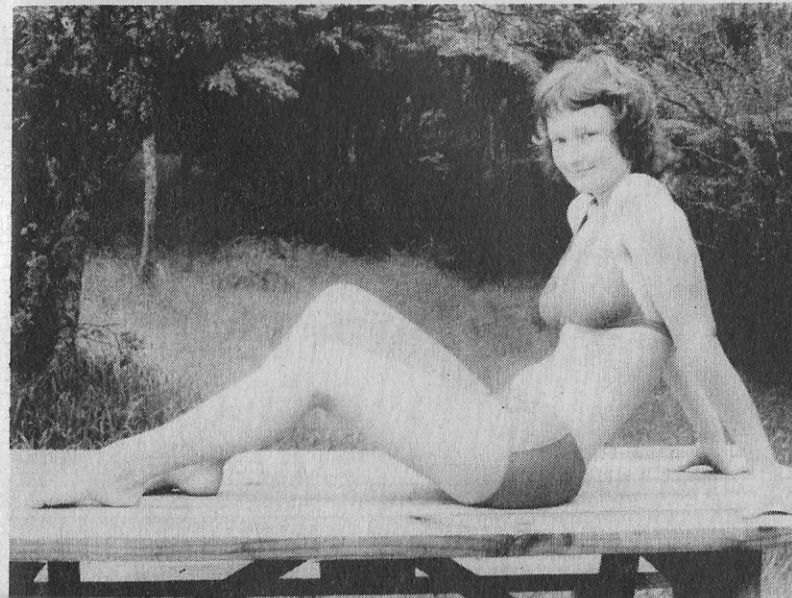
So once again the sight of Photo News Photographers will be a familiar one at the many events and functions that occur every week throughout Taranaki.

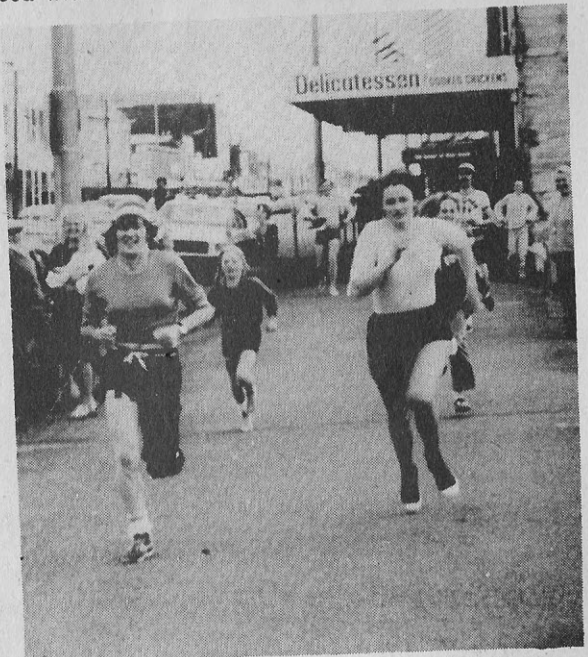
## FIRE GUTS NEW PLYMOUTH BUILDING



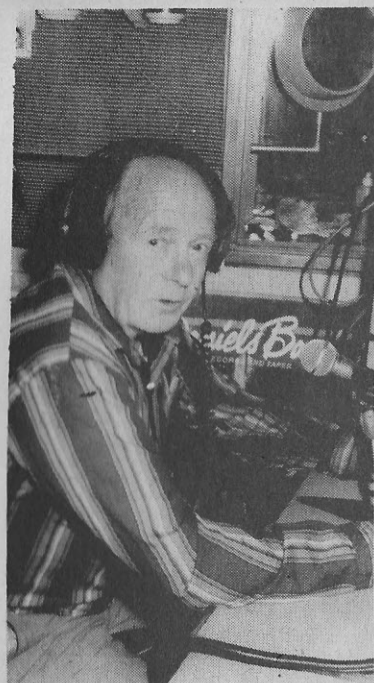

The Radiothon lasted most of a Sunday and by day's end over \$23,000 had been raised via pledges.

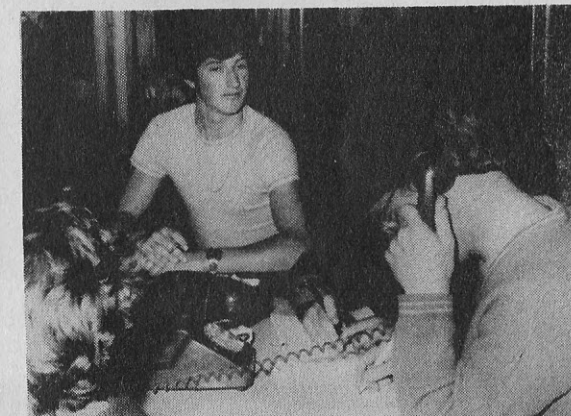

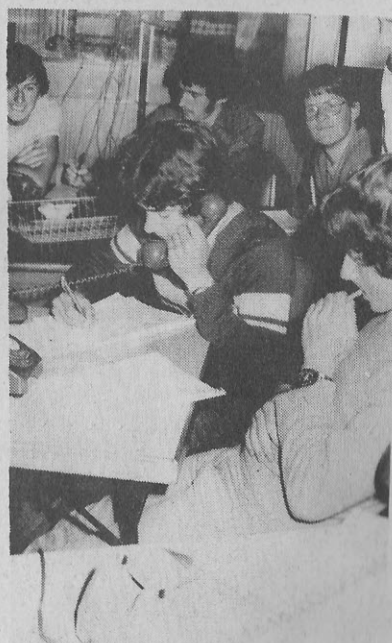

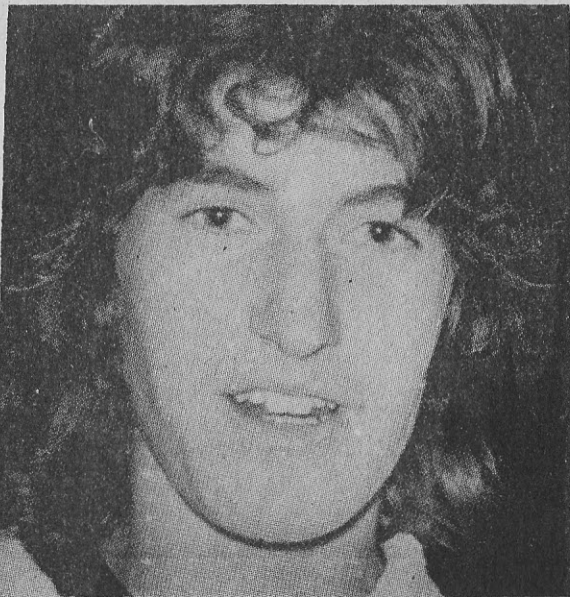
# Taranaki Sportsman of the Year

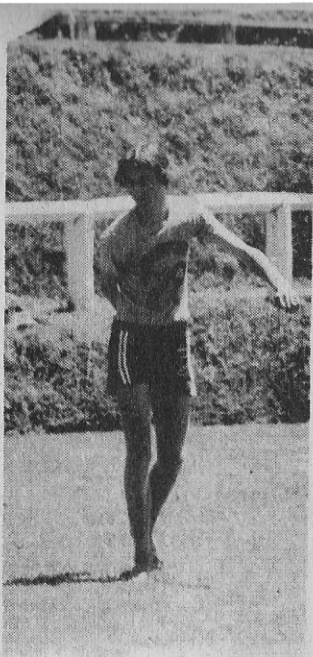

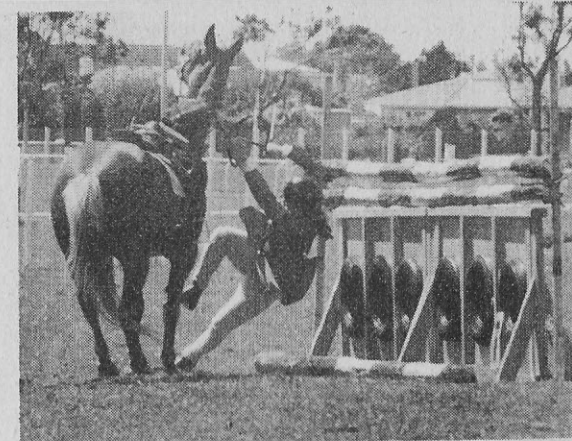

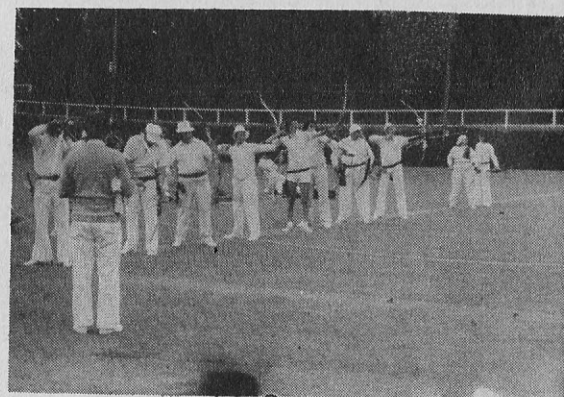

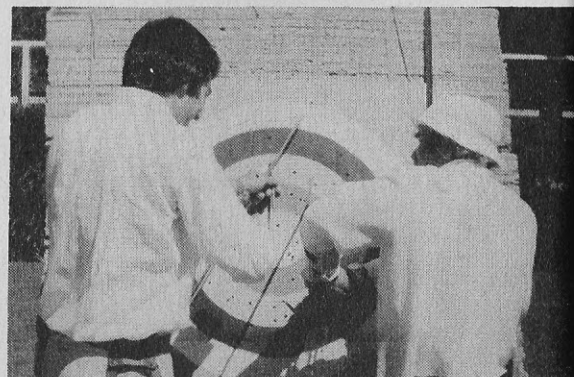

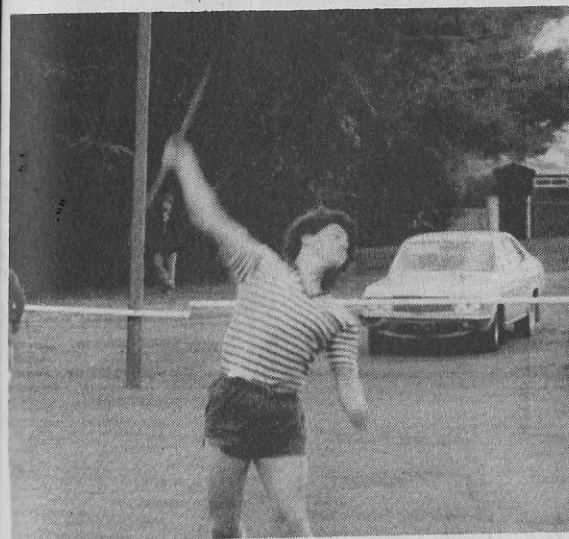

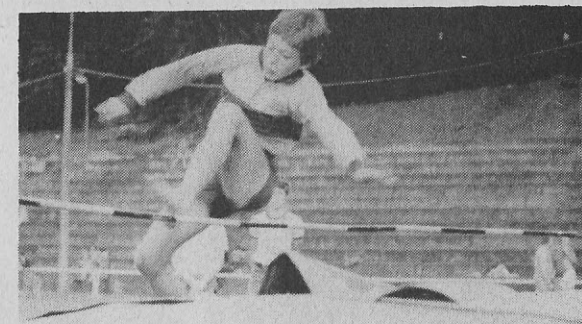
## ATHLETIC CLUB'S 1st MEET OF THE SEASON

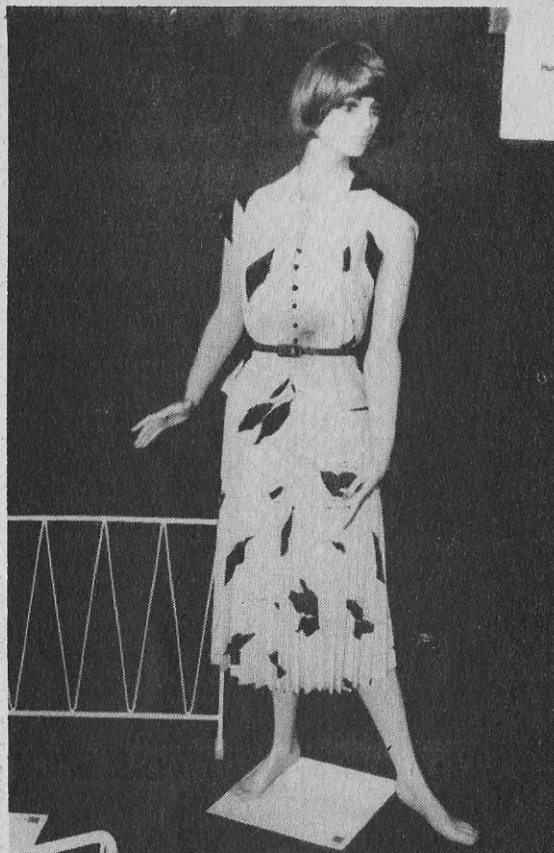

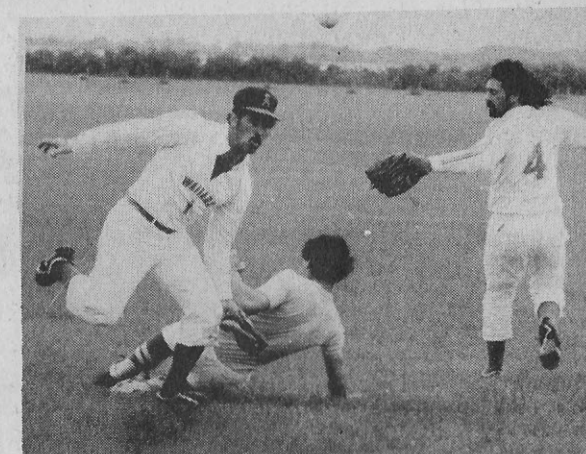

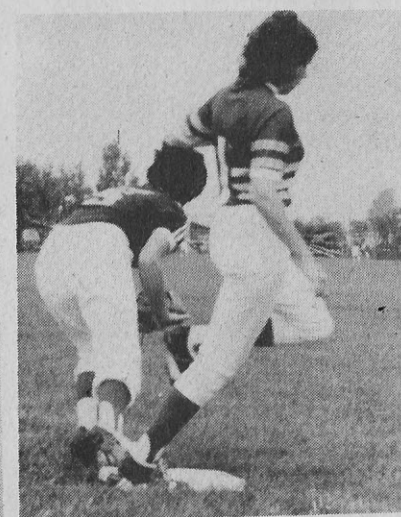

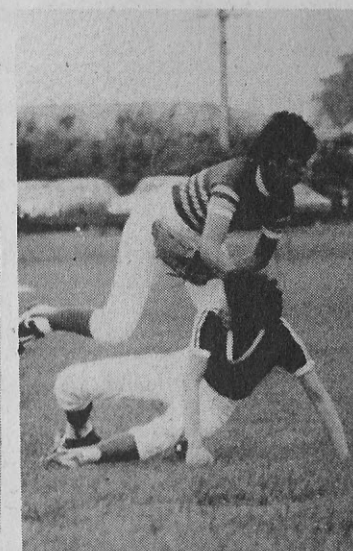

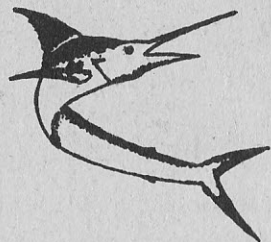

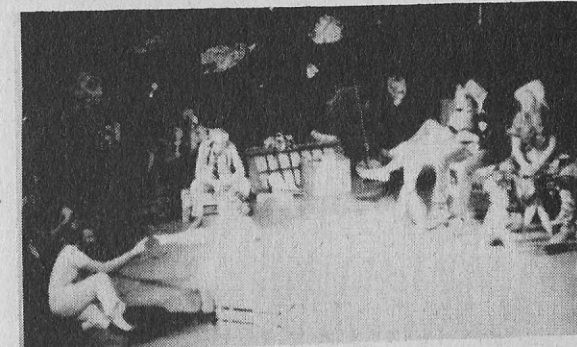

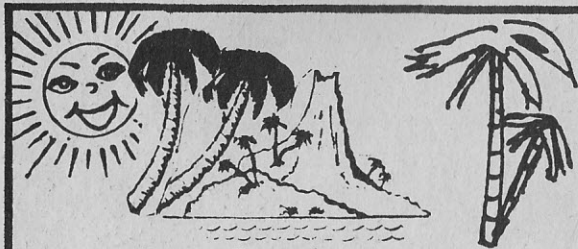

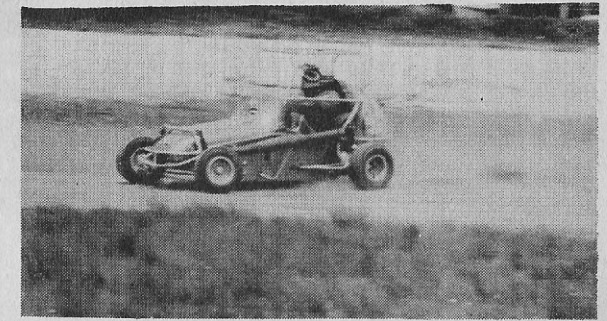

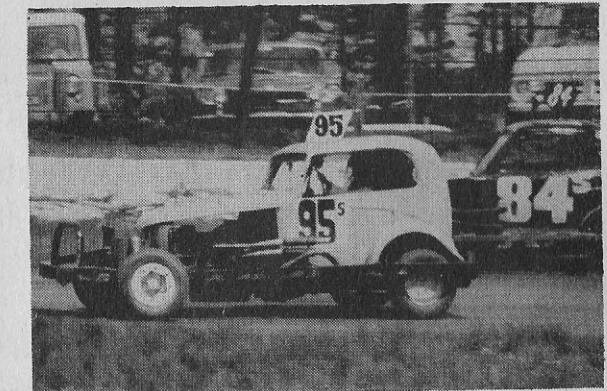

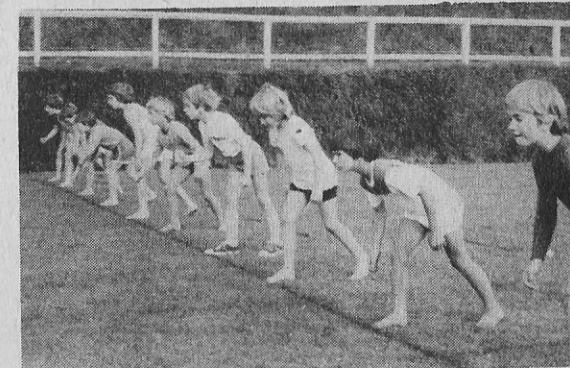

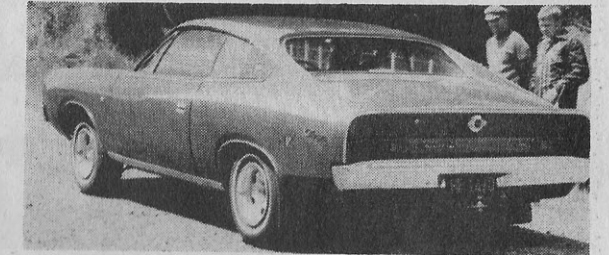

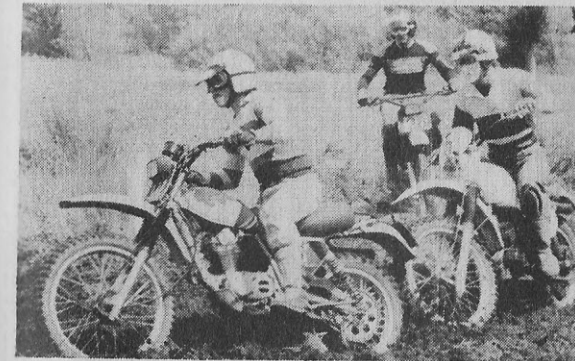

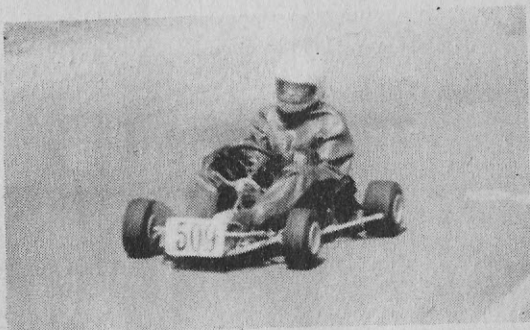

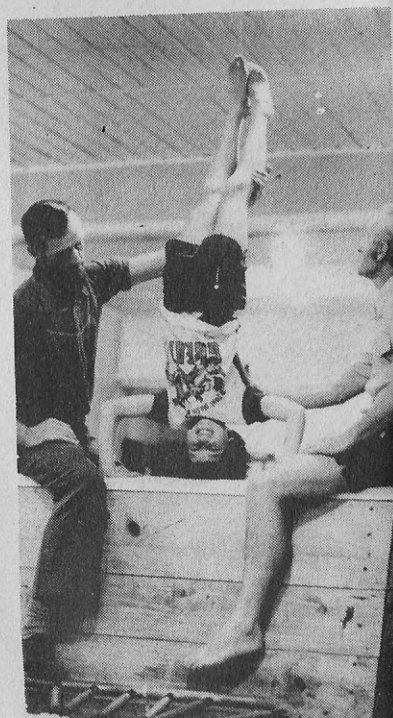

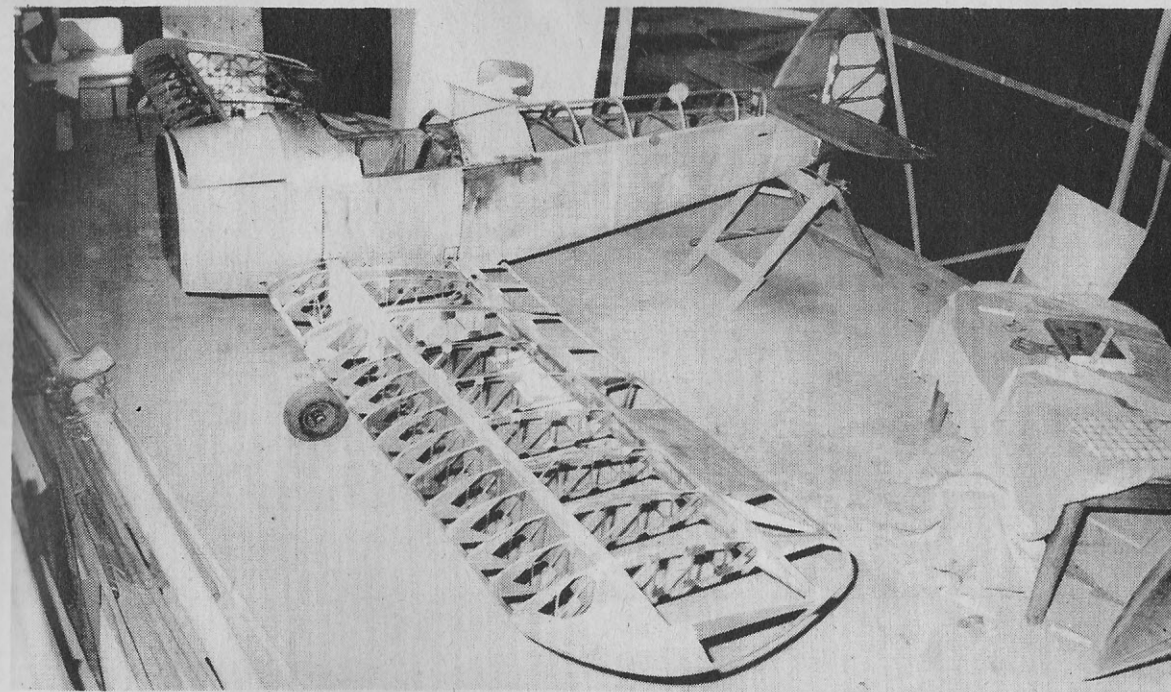
